

## 2021-2022 NYI ANNUAL REPORT

—This year we saw the establishment of a new student led Bible study where students explored the book of James in depth. This study, hosted by the Gorton family and led by student Isaac Davis, ran for 6 weeks during the season of Lent and saw anywhere between 5-10 students meeting each week to study the Word of God.

—Nevaeh Vanderbur is an 8th grade student who this year professed faith in Jesus and accepted him as her Lord and Savior for the very first time at Xtreme in Hutchinson, KS. Nevaeh’s mom has even reached out to youth staff to express the change she has observed in her daughter since that night. Nevaeh has also since then brought over a dozen friends to CROCS so that they could hear about Jesus, too. She has now recently attended church camp for the first time where she is learning more about what it means to follow Jesus.

—During the school year, we established a homeschool and hybrid learning ministry on Fridays during the school day. In this new ministry, homeschool and hybrid learning students would come to the church to meet with Pastor Gage, hear a short devotional, and play board games together. As a result, we saw new students make the jump from this ministry and engage with our CROCS midweek service for the very first time.

—We sent three students to The Call at MNU to explore God’s calling in their lives. Josiah Stephenson, Isaac Davis, and Paige Kramp are now actively taking steps to pursue God’s call in their lives both in and out of our church.
